


Water Conservation Garden


In response to California's drought and the need to save water, the City of Morgan Hill is making its public facilities more 'water wise' by establishing drought tolerant landscaping.

The landscape established outside the CCC demonstrates different gardening practices, plants, and irrigation methods that significantly saves water, while also maintaining an aesthetically pleasing appearance. Three different drought tolerant plant communities are incorporated that are all adapted to thrive within California's climate.


Along with drought tolerant plants, the garden also utilizes compatible hardscape materials, such as decomposed granite pathways, dry river rock beds, and decorative boulders. Water is still able to reach the soil and be retained for the plants through these permeable surfaces.
