**Note:** Additional wildfire safety work is planned for this year and will be available in the next progress update. All work plans are subject to change due to weather, access or other schedule constraints.

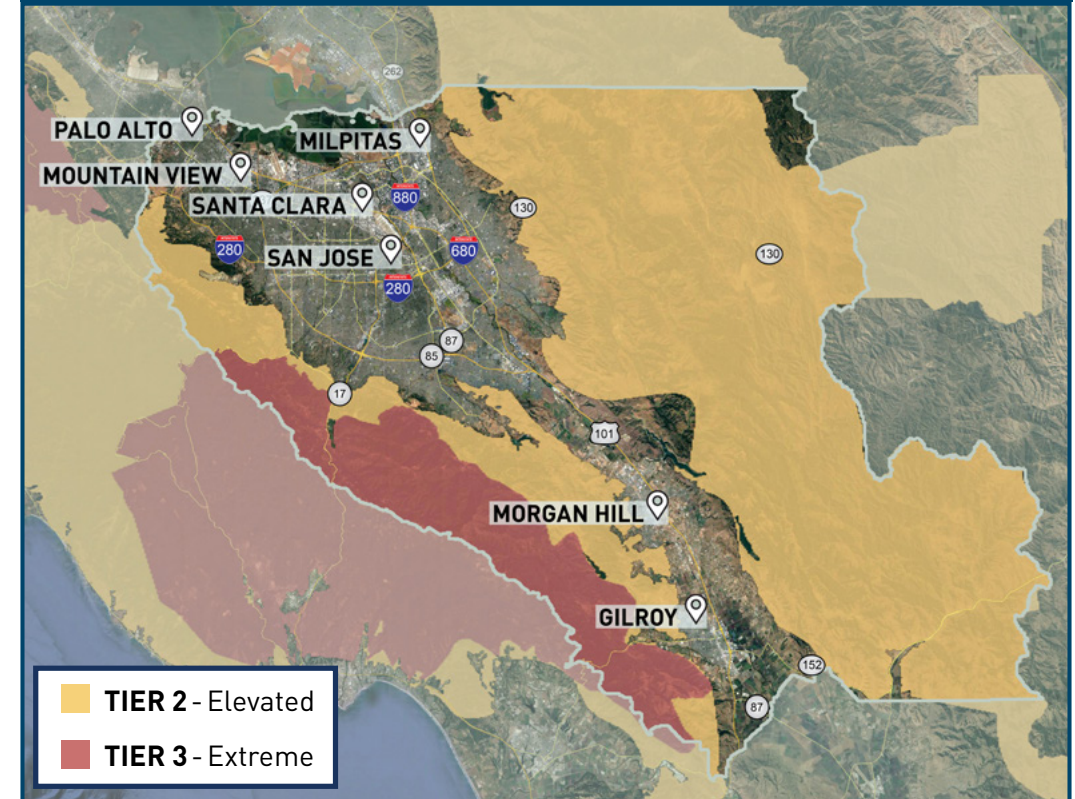

# COMMUNITY WILDFIRE SAFETY PROGRAM KEY INITIATIVE DESCRIPTIONS

**Below is an overview of our key wildfire safety improvement efforts.**

<b>COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTERS</b>	Identifying more locations to provide customers with resources to meet basic power needs and up-to-date information during a PSPS event
<b>COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION PARTNERSHIPS</b>	Providing resources and information to customers before, during and after PSPS events including emergency planning assistance, food replacement options, portable backup batteries and hotel accommodations
<b>SYSTEM HARDENING</b>	Installing stronger poles and covered lines and conducting targeted undergrounding to harden our infrastructure and reduce wildfire risk
<b>TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION SECTIONALIZING DEVICES</b>	Installing sectionalizing devices to separate the electric grid into smaller sections to reduce wildfire risk and narrow the scope of PSPS events
<b>ENHANCED VEGETATION MANAGEMENT</b>	Meeting and exceeding state vegetation standards to manage trees and other vegetation located near power lines that could cause a wildfire or power outage
<b>WEATHER STATIONS</b>	Adding state-of-the-art weather tools to improve weather forecasting that will help better predict and target where and when PSPS events are necessary
<b>HIGH-DEFINITION CAMERAS</b>	Allowing us to better pinpoint how to best prevent and respond to the risk of wildfires

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
